



Level 1 Water Restriction in Effect in Town of Wembley

Effective May 29, 2019, the Town of Wembley is enforcing a Level 1 water restriction in accordance with the Town of Wembley By-law 662, The Water Restriction By-law.

This by-law is in effect for the protection of the current water supply as Aquatera is not yet supplying water to the Town of Wembley. The following schedule is in place until further notice:

- Odd numbered addresses may water lawns Tuesday, Thursday and Sunday.
- Even numbered addresses may water lawns Monday, Wednesday and Saturday.
- Watering may occur only during the following hours of 6 a.m. - 9 a.m. and 7 p.m. - 11 p.m.



Gardens may be watered by hand, at anytime, using a watering can or a hose with a nozzle with a trigger shut off to restrict water flow. Sprinklers and like water toys may be used for recreational purposes by children as long as children are present during use; This includes children's pools with capacity not more than 1000 litres. Wembley Sanitary Upgrade

The Effluent Discharge Quality Recommendations have been received for both continuous and semi-annual discharges. ISL Engineering and Aquatera will begin reviewing technology options for upgrades to the treatment system. Cleanup of the facultative cell berms occurred in early June 2019. Review of the lift stations has commenced and identified options and the scope of work to enable remote monitoring and control from Aquatera's treatment plant; the identified work to enable remote monitoring is underway and will be completed in early July. Aquatera has started preliminary design for the lift station #1 replacement.



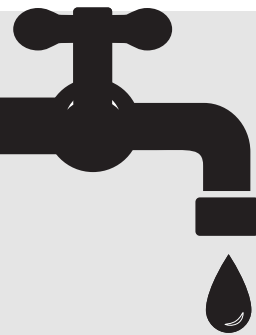
The Town of Wembley wastewater treatment and collection system assets transferred to Aquatera on July 1, 2019 and Aquatera now owns and operates this service as well as the water service. Garbage and recycling will continue to remain the responsibility of the Town of Wembley.

Smart Irrigation

Water and wastewater charges reflect the amount of water you consume. Water and wastewater charges are like your groceries - you pay for what you need. Each month, we calculate the cost by multiplying the amount of water consumed (cubic meter) by the current water and wastewater rates. We can't differentiate between water that is coming out of your kitchen tap, water that is being flushed, or water that is being used to tend to your outdoor space, therefore all water is treated.
